Summary of 2023-24 Stomp Cheer Changes

Major Changes (may affect scoring):

- Stomp Creativity section removed.
- Skill Incorporation section added. Worth 5 points. See rubric for full details.
- Stomp Synchronization and Precision is now out of 5 points.
- 5 points added to the value of overall.
- One new element added to the final section to encourage high levels of participation throughout routines.
- Final score on Cheer now out of 45.

Minor Changes (not likely to affect scoring):

- Some terms changed for consistency across all score sheets and rubrics.
- Notes and definitions section new to rubric for clarifying statements.
- Removal of all "RD"s on subjective elements on rubric.

Stomp Cheer Rubric

This rubric interpretation will include language from the score sheet and rubric. The titles, point values, and descriptions in quotes are copied from the score sheet. The content for low, average, and high ranges has been copied from the rubric.

If there is an error preventing the playing of music, judges will use their best judgment to evaluate what they determine to be elements performed in the "cheer section" as distinguished from the "music section" containing building and dance.

(Stomp) Difficulty (10) is defined as stomp difficulty elements pertaining specifically to the non-music portion of the stomp routine. It will be interpreted as "Step Work, Transitions, Formation/Level Changes, Number of Beats/Rhythms, Pace/Speed Changes" as demonstrated in the cheer section. According to the rubric, the judges are looking for the demonstration of the following *difficulty* elements throughout:

- Level of step work
- Level of clean and distinct step work during transitions
- Number of formations changes (see rubric for ranges)
- Number of level changes (see rubric for ranges)
- Number of dynamic audible beats/rhythms (see rubric for ranges)
- Level of use of dynamic pace and speed changes

Skill Incorporation (5) is defined as "Jumps, Kicks, Tumbling, Lifts, etc." performed specifically to the non-music portion of the stomp routine. According to the rubric, the judges are looking for the demonstration of the following *effectiveness* elements throughout:

- Level of creativity of skill incorporations
- Level of smoothness and flow of skill incorporations in with the other stomp elements
- Level of enhancing impact on the other stomp elements
- Notes and Definitions:
 - Score will be zero (0) if no "skills" are incorporated into the cheer portion of the routine.
 - "Skills" will be defined as jumps, kicks, tumbling, lifts, leaps, spins or other creative skills that enhance the rhythms/beats and vocals of stomp.
 - Difficulty of skills is not to be assessed, but the effectiveness of the incorporation of skills pertaining to the criteria listed.

(Stomp) Execution **(20)** is defined as stomp execution elements pertaining specifically to the non-music portion of the stomp routine.

• (Stomp) Rhythm & Beat (10) - will be interpreted as "Clarity/Pace/Tempo/Uniformity in Beat Patterns & Strong Movement Through Rhythm Changes" as demonstrated during the cheer section. According to the rubric, the judges are looking for the demonstration of the following execution elements specifically relating to the "seeing AND hearing" of rhythms and beats used:

- Level of melody of step chant
- Level of visual clarity of beat patterns
- Level of audible uniformity of pace and step rhythm
- Level of movement distinction during rhythm changes

- (Stomp) Synchronization & Precision (5) will be interpreted as "Sharp Motions, Consistent Motion Style, Precision, Group Synchronization" as demonstrated during the cheer section.
 According to the rubric, the judges are looking for the demonstration of the following execution elements specifically relating to the motions and movement used:
 - Level of cleanliness and sharpness of motions
 - Level of consistency of motion style throughout
 - Level of motion placement
 - Level of movement precision
 - Level of synchronization
- (Stomp) Vocal Dynamics (5) will be interpreted as "Voices are clear and projected with proper articulation, volume remains controlled through progressive dynamics" as demonstrated during the cheer section. According to the rubric, the judges are looking for the demonstration of the following execution elements specifically relating to the vocals used:
 - Level of clarity of voices
 - Level of voice projection
 - Level of articulation through pace and tone (uniformity)
 - Level of volume control during vocal dynamics

Routine Composition & Showmanship (10) will be defined as: "Choreography, Flow Between Sections, Entertainment Value, Team Stylized Attitude Throughout, Participation" for the Music section. According to the rubric, the judges are looking for the level of presentation of the following elements:

- Level of fluidity of transitions into and out of Music
- Level of use of choreography
- Level of energy driving entertainment value
- Level of stylized attitude throughout
- Level of consistency of participation of team members (NOTE: this includes but is not limited to minimizing the hiding of unused "nuggets", performing skills and choreography simultaneously)
